
Ponder Over...... Today is Bible Sunday. It is important to have His word dominant in our lives. Most of us are ruled by our five senses, what we hear, touch, feel, smell and see and yet as believers we should walk by faith not by sight. Our mind must come under the dominion of God's word. The dominance of God's word over our lives can only come through reading and meditating God's word daily in our lives. In Job 23:12 we read: "I have not departed from the commandment of His lips, I have treasured the words of His mouth more than my necessary food". This is how we should value God's word. Our attitude towards the word of God, determines the place that God holds in our daily lives. it should never be like words coming from an ordinary book. We should never treat God's word as a common book. The word should get into our blood and life. His word has to become part of us. We should

become so lost in His word that His word is found in us. Early churchmen used a system, called the Lectio Divina, included four steps: reading a scripture, meditating upon it, praying it and contemplating on it. Likewise, we must ponder the scripture, attempting to expand our understanding of it and consider how it applies to our own experience in order for it to provide us with the highest benefit. Choose a small portion of scripture and



read it over and over until it is very familiar. Then meditate on it by pondering its meaning. Apply it to yourself in various ways. Look at each word or phrase individually. Write a little personal commentary on each portion. Finally, when you have "chewed" on it enough, pray it. It is all too easy to read the scripture "religiously" and then forget what it says. But when we meditate and pray a portion of what we read, we will not become what James called, "a hearer of the word and not a doer." As this occurs and we are changed into His likeness by the transforming power of the Word. In Joshua 1:8-9 God tells Joshua to meditate on His word day and night. He told Joshua that he would be bold, courageous, prosperous and successful. This would happen all because of meditation on God's word. It is important to note that our actions are based on the patterns of our thinking. We can never be tempted by something that we don't think of. We never do anything that our thoughts haven't already carved out. We don't do what we haven't already lived out in our imagination. We follow our dominant thoughts. Indeed, the word is the greatest treasure any believer can ever have "The law of Your mouth is better to me than thousands of coins of gold and silver" (Psalm 119:72). "Therefore, I love your commandments, more than gold, yes, than fine gold. Therefore, all your precepts concerning all things I consider to be right, I hate every false way" (Psalm119:127-128). I wish we knew how valuable the Word of God is to our lives.
